Transformative Opportunities

Summer Chamber Camp

The **Illinois Chamber Music Festival at IWU** is a two-week, on-campus, residential event for high school age musicians who wish to participate in intensive chamber music training. It includes daily coaching, rehearsals, master classes, and performances by students and faculty. We started sending a few eligible students a few years ago, and the word that describes their experience is **transformative**. They come back energized and enthusiastic about what music means to them and can do in their lives.

A Cross Section of McLean County

Our Scholar Demographics

Pratt Music Scholars represent a cross-section of children in our community:

The **Pratt Music Foundation** Scholarship Class of 2018-2019 includes 17 students from Bloomington, 14 from Normal, and one each from Washington, Heyworth, and Gridley. Eighteen students study piano, seven study violin, two study viola, and four pursue the cello. Nine students attend District 87 schools, sixteen attend Unit 5 schools, four are homeschooled, three attend private schools (Epiphany, St. Mary's, and Cornerstone) one attends the Illinois Math and Science Academy, and one attends CUSD 51.

The thirty-four **Pratt Music Foundation** Scholars for 2018-2019 represent an investment (this year) of over \$47,300 in the next generation of music in our community.

Our Partner Program: Illinois Symphony, the Music Shoppe, Pratt Music Foundation Share The Music

Bloomington-Normal has exceptional in-school music programs; any student can (starting at about fourth or fifth grade) learn an instrument and participate in band or orchestra. Many continue through high school and find their lives forever changed because of music. But, students cannot participate if they can't afford an instrument.

Share The Music lends instruments (the whole range: violins, violas, cellos, clarinets, trumpets, saxophones, oboes, even digital pianos) to students who can't afford them for an annual rental of \$20, and we waive that for over half the participants.

Share The Music currently has 238 instruments out on loan...fully 7% of the students in the music programs at District 87 and Unit 5. The **Share The Music** program has grown every year since it started in 2008, and promises to keep growing for the foreseeable future.

Responsible Funds Management:

100% Goes To Program

100% of your support goes to our endowment; earnings are used only for music lesson scholarships. Last year, we spent \$47,300 on private music lessons in our community: 34 students at \$1250 each, and three Chamber Music Camp students at \$1600 each. Few organizations in our community are granting at this level.
